



## GUIDE TO HIGH SCHOOL SUMMER PROGRAMS 2009

### *Mission Statement*

*The Virginia Beach City Public Schools, in partnership with the entire community, will empower every student to become a life-long learner who is a responsible, productive, and engaged citizen within the global community.*

### GENERAL INFORMATION

This guide provides students and parents with specific information about the programs that are available in summer school. Students and parents should review this publication and consult with guidance counselors and/or teachers to determine which programs may be appropriate. When selecting a program, it is important to remember that all courses offered in the Virginia Beach City Public Schools are available on a non-discriminatory basis.

Students and parents should note that all programs are dependent on sufficient enrollment and the availability of qualified and appropriately endorsed instructional staff. Also, enrollment in some courses may be limited due to the availability of equipment and space at a particular school. Lack of enrollment sometimes necessitates the consolidation of classes and may require students to go to a summer school site other than the one at which they originally registered. If a course is cancelled due to insufficient enrollment, students may be allowed to enroll in the course at another site. Transportation outside the cluster will **not** be provided.

*Note: Unless otherwise noted, all courses are restricted to students in grades 9-12 only. Rising 9<sup>th</sup> grade students may also attend high school summer programs.*

### ATTENDANCE AND CONDUCT

Attendance during summer school should be monitored in accordance with School Board Policy 5-17. Teachers will maintain an accurate record of attendance/absences by class session.

Each summer school course consists of two class sessions per day. Students are expected to be in attendance at each class session each day. A student will not be granted credit or considered for promotion to the next grade level if absences are excessive. For students taking courses for credit toward graduation, excessive absences are defined as missing more than four (4) class sessions (the equivalent of two days) within a given semester.

A parent may request a waiver of the summer school attendance policy by submitting the standard waiver request form to the summer school principal **at the end of each summer school semester**. Appeals should be forwarded to Denise White, coordinator of Student Services, in the Office of Student Leadership.

The *Code of Student Conduct* outlines the expectations for student behavior. Students will be subject to suspension or dismissal from classes by the summer school principal if they violate policies with regard to student conduct or if their behavior is disruptive and interferes with classroom instruction. If a student is dismissed due to behavior, he/she is not eligible for a refund of summer school tuition. Adherence to the School Board code of dress shall be maintained: "All students are expected to wear dress appropriate to the occasion; extreme or ostentatious apparel or appearance is to be avoided. Any article of clothing or accessory which advertises alcohol or an illegal substance, depicts lewd graphics, displays offensive or obscene language, or is gang related is forbidden.

### TRANSFER OF CREDIT

Summer school courses not taken in the Virginia Beach City Public Schools must meet the requirements of courses taken in Virginia Beach. It is the responsibility of the student to obtain **prior** written permission from the principal of the student's home school to determine acceptability of subjects taken or credits earned in summer school outside the Virginia Beach city public school system.

## REGISTRATION

Students must register on **June 23 or June 24, 2009, between 8:00 a.m. and noon**, at the summer school cluster site that includes their current school (see chart on next page). Registration for Driver Education will be **June 23 and 24** (see information on page 6). Registration for Summer Special Education and English as a Second Language (ESL) Programs will be handled separately. Registration for online courses through Virtual Virginia Beach e-Learning will take place at the same times and locations indicated above, but the student is to download, complete, print, and bring a special registration form that can be found at <http://www.vbschools.com/> at the Distance Learning link. Information about these programs and the registration procedures will be sent to each school. Only students whose parents are residents of Virginia Beach are eligible to attend summer school classes. Secondary students must provide their student identification number at the time of registration. Students should bring their schedule or report card (from the third grading period) that shows the preprinted student ID number. Please refer to the program description for details. **Tuition must be paid in full at the time of registration.**

## TUITION

English as a Second Language Program (ESL), SOL Fast Track Tutoring, and the Algebra Readiness Academy Program are provided at no cost. Other summer programs that are offered have a tuition charge. Please check the program descriptions in this guide to determine whether fees are charged for particular programs. Tuition must be paid at the time of registration and includes the use of textbooks. All checks should be made payable to **Virginia Beach City Public Schools**. VISA and/or MasterCard may be used to pay tuition. Outstanding non-sufficient fund checks for summer school tuition must be paid before the student may attend summer school. **Reduced tuition is not available for enrichment programs. More information on tuition payment is provided in the table below.**

## REDUCED TUITION FOR ELIGIBLE STUDENTS

Students who have a completed free/reduced lunch form on file and have been determined eligible for reduced price or free meals during the regular school year are also eligible to receive reduced summer school tuition in all high school summer programs except enrichment programs. Parents or guardians who would like the school to determine their child's eligibility for free and reduced tuition **must sign the release section of the registration form**. This will permit school officials to access the necessary information to award the tuition benefit. If a student qualifies for the benefit, the chart below lists the tuition rates.

**NOTE: Free/reduced lunch form applications should be filed at the student's home school by June 18, 2009.**

## REFUNDS

Requests for refunds must be made using the Summer School Tuition Refund Request form and submitted to the summer school principal before the first day of class. Because teachers must be hired in advance, **no refunds** will be honored after that date.

## TRANSPORTATION

Schools have been grouped together to form transportation clusters. Bus transportation will be available for many programs from neighborhood pickup points within the cluster to designated summer school sites. If transportation is provided for a particular program, it will be listed with the information in this guide describing the program. Specific bus route information will be available on the school division's summer school section at [www.vbschools.com](http://www.vbschools.com), in each school by June 17, 2009, and will appear in the *Beacon* by Sunday, June 21, 2009. The summer school principals establish procedures for students interested in driving private cars to summer school centers. Limited parking passes are available for students who drive to school for a fee of \$10. **Transportation is provided only within the transportation clusters.**

## HIGH SCHOOL SUMMER SCHOOL SITES 2009

Students must attend classes at the summer school site located within their transportation cluster. Students who have been removed from their home or enrolled schools as a result of disciplinary infractions are not allowed to attend summer school at that site. The first school listed in each line (**bold print**) is the summer school site. Students will attend Monday through Thursday. Salem High School will serve as the host site for all online classes. Any necessary face-to-face class meetings and SOL tests will take place at the host school.

*Transportation will not be provided to other sites when a course is cancelled due to insufficient enrollment. Parents/students are responsible for providing transportation to alternate sites.*

### PROGRAM DESCRIPTIONS

The high school summer program provides credit courses to be taken in order for high school students to accelerate their program of study or to repeat courses not successfully completed during the regular school year. Students enrolling in a credit bearing course for the first time must complete a 30-day instructional program equal to one year of instruction in the regular school year (two semesters in length) to receive full credit. Students repeating a course they have previously failed may earn credit by completing a 15-day (one semester) program to receive full credit. If the repeat course needed is not offered in a 15-day format, students may elect to take the 30-day course offering. Note: All online course offerings are in the 30-day format. All course offerings are subject to having sufficient enrollment and certified staff to teach them.

All Virginia Beach public school students taking a summer school course which requires an End-of-Course (EOC) SOL test must take the SOL test scheduled during summer school, unless the student has already passed the test. Students must be enrolled for the 2009-2010 school year before testing begins. All SOL tests except English: Writing require one day of testing. Students who are graduating by August 2010 or earlier and are taking the SOL EOC English: Writing test require four days of testing. Students who are not graduating by August 2010 or earlier and are taking the SOL EOC English: Writing test require two days of testing.

Special Note: Seniors who lack two credits to be eligible to graduate in August must attend Ocean Lakes High School where morning and afternoon sessions will be offered. Transportation will not be provided for students outside the Ocean Lakes High School cluster.

Students must have **satisfactorily completed** the classroom theory phase of driver education. **Students must bring their DEC-1 form to registration** and have a valid learner's permit in their possession. **Seniors** will be able to register from **8:00 a.m. – 10:30 a.m.** Registration for **juniors** will begin at **10:45 a.m. – noon**. *Special Note: In addition to the age requirement of sixteen (16) years and three (3) months, a student must have all of the following in order to receive a temporary driver's license at the end of the course: good academic standing, possession of his/her learner's permit for nine (9) months, and a completed 40-hour driving log. The license will be held until all these conditions are met. Effective July 1, 2008, HB889- Required driving hours for holders of learner's permit. Increases the minimum driving hours from 40 to 45 hours, at least 15 of which must be after sunset. The bill additionally requires certification of the hours driven.*

The English as a Second Language (ESL) high school summer program is designed for students in grades 9-12 who are limited in English proficiency (LEP) and performing at English proficiency levels 1 and 2. Eligible English language learners are recommended and registered in advance at their home schools by their ESL teachers. Tuition is free and transportation is provided. This class is for rising 9<sup>th</sup> graders who will be taking Algebra I or Introduction to Algebra I and need to strengthen their pre-algebra skills. The program is designed to help students become confident in their ability to succeed in mathematics, learn the value of mathematics, become problem solvers, communicate mathematically, and learn to reason using mathematics. It is recommended that any student who earned a grade of “C” or below as their final average for Mathematics 8 participate in the program. This class is non-graded, but a pass/fail notation based on attendance and participation will be recorded.
